Richard Kilty

Richard Kilty (born 2 September 1989), a British track and field sprinter who competes in the 60 metres, 100 metres and 200 metres, visited Roseberry on Thursday to lead an assembly about his journey from Billingham to major athlete. Richard attended Pentland Primary as a young child and went on to Northfield. At one point, Richard and his family were homeless and lived in temporary shared accommodation. He was so hard up that he could not afford the £5 fee to train at Claireville Stadium so instead he ran along the banks of the river Tees and practised hill sprints around Teesside.

In Richard's words, "I had no money and no support; it was just me and my legs. It's been a really tough journey but coming out the other side as world champion tastes so much sweeter because of it."

The message given to the children was that regardless of a talent you may have, you have to be resilient - work hard and train hard.

Having failed to compete in 2012 due to a hamstring injury, Richard gave up athletics for 6 months due to disillusionment but started to train again and took part in the Rio Olympics where, as part of the 100 metre relay team, was placed 5th. Richard will hopefully take part in the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo.



Inspire2Learn

On Monday, four lucky children from Year 5 visited Inspire2Learn, in Middlesbrough, to take on an 'Enterprise Challenge'. Enterprise skills cover a huge range of different areas but for this particular challenge, the children focussed on using effective teamwork, creativity and audience analysis to underpin a 'Dad LEGO set' task. After identifying key techniques that are used in adverts, the children then created their own product based on value propositions they had identified for the target audience. Changes to School Health

We have been asked to draw your attention to school health. Please see below the letter we have been asked to share with parents and carers.



26th March 2018

Dear Parent/Carer

From 1 April 2018, Harrogate and District NHS Foundation Trust (HDFT) will be providing the 0-19 Healthy Child Programme Service in Stockton on Tees, transferring over from North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust (NTHFT) and will form part of a new approach to working with children, young people and families.

The 0-19 Service will work with children, young people and families in Stockton and will be made up of Health Visitors, Public Health Nurses and support staff delivering on the Healthy Child Programme, the 'Growing Well, Growing Healthy Team' and a family outreach service. The family outreach service will work on a one to one or group basis providing support in family homes and community venues as well as recruiting and supporting local volunteers to work across all community areas in Stockton.

Staff from NTHFT will be transferring across to HDFT on 1 April 2018. The team will continue to be based in Stockton borough and provide children, young people and families with a local service.

HDFT will work with children, young people and their parents/carers in a variety of settings; schools, health centres, GP surgeries, youth venues and in the family home. The Healthy Child Programme Team will offer routine health checks on children starting school and on transfer to secondary schools.

In addition, the team will work closely with nurseries, schools and colleges to improve the health and well-being of children and young people. They will continue to be responsible for measuring and weighing children as part of the National Child Measurement Programme.

Every school and GP practice will continue to have a Named Public Health Nurse to ensure communication and referrals into the service are easy and accessible.

To ensure the continuity of care a summary or a copy of records used to deliver these services will be transferred to or shared with HDFT in order to allow them to continue to provide a high quality service.

We are working closely to focus on making sure services transfer smoothly across to them and there is no gap in care being provided.

For those affected we have included a frequently asked question sheet which may answer queries that you may have relating to transfer of data. Frequently Asked Questions for those affected

Where will our information be held?

Your current health record will transfer from North Tees and Hartlepool Foundation Trust (NTHFT) to Harrogate and District NHS Foundation Trust (HDFT) and will be held securely on our child health information system which is called Systmone. This is to ensure that we are able to continue to provide the best care for you and your family. NTHFT will hold any historical health records in an archive which you will be able to access by contacting them directly.

Can I see my school nursing, health visitor or family nurse record?

Yes, Data Protection Legislation allows you to find out what information is held about you, on paper and computer records. If you wish to see a copy of your records you should contact HDFT and we will advise you further. You are entitled to receive a copy of your records for a statutory fee. In certain circumstances access to your records may be limited, for example if your records contain information relating to another.

Who else will you share my information with?

We may share your information with organisations who may contribute to your support. These could include:

- Your GP and any other NHS organisation
- Audit organisations
- NHS Digital

What is my information used for?

Your records are used to help us to provide you with the best possible care and support. It is important that your records are accurate and up to date as this will help the staff who are working with you so they can provide you with the support you need, when you need it.

If you have a concern or problem with your care, your records will help us with any investigation. We may also use your information to improve the services we provide to you through audits and monitoring.

Will you keep my health records confidential?

We are required by law to keep your information confidential however we have to report certain information to the appropriate authorities. This is only provided after permission has been given by a qualified professional.


